HE's hydroelectric economics practice continued to expand with projects in western Colorado and northwestern Nebraska. Our team celebrated when the first alternative water transfer mechanism (ATM) successfully created and negotiated in the Berthoud, CO area. Harvey Economics continues its rate-making work in Fountain and has begun similar work for a nearby utility. We also work in Arizona for the Salt River Project and the Gila River Indian Community. HE completed an economic evaluation of a Wyoming solar facility and a series of gravel pits in northern Colorado.
